Excellence in Education

AP Exam

Each year students taking AP classes participate in an AP Exam that compares our students with their peers in the state of Kentucky as well as across the globe.

In 2011, 134 AP students at Christian Academy of Louisville took the exam with **90.3%** or 121 scoring a 3 or higher, which is a strong predictor of a student's ability to persist in college and earn a bachelor's degree. In the state of Kentucky, 50.6% of AP students who took the exam scored a 3 or higher, and 60.2% of global AP students attained this score.

ACT

The ACT consists of curriculum-based tests of educational development in English, mathematics, reading and science designed to measure the skills needed for success in first year college coursework. In 2011, Christian Academy of Louisville students scored an average 26.1 composite score. In the state of Kentucky, students averaged a 19.6 composite score, and students across the nation averaged a 21.1 composite score.

College Attendance

Of the Class of 2011, 99% attend a four-year college and .5% attend a two-year college. Fifty percent attend an in-state, public, four-year college.

Academic Distinction

The Class of 2011 had three National Merit Finalists and two National Merit Commended students. Two students were candidates for the United States Presidential Scholars Program, seven were Governor's Scholars and two students were accepted to the Governor's School for the Arts.

Twenty-four students were recognized as AP Scholars (*passing 3 AP exams*), 11 students were recognized as AP Scholars with Honors (*passing 4 AP exams*), five students were recognized as AP Scholars with Distinction (*passing 6 AP exams*) and three students received a Kentucky Commonwealth Diploma (*students who take AP classes in four specified subjects*).

Core Courses

Middle School students have the opportunity to engage in Bible class, Literature, Language Arts, Math, Science and History.

Accelerated Courses

Christian Academy offers accelerated courses in the following areas: Pre-Algebra (*7th grade*), Algebra I (*8th grade*) and Accelerated Introduction to Chemistry and Physics (*8th grade*).

Exploratory Courses

Art, Band, Physical Education, Orchestra, Choir, Spanish, Computer and Spiritual Life courses are offered throughout the year.

Extracurricular Activities

Christian Academy School System participates in *The Stanford Achievement Test*, the nation's oldest and most widely recognized national standardized test. Christian Academy Students in grades K-5 typically score at or above the 80th percentile of all students taking the test nationally. Students in grades 6-8 typically score at or above the 78th percentile. The national average is the 50th percentile. Class size at Christian Academy is a major contributing factor in the success of our students. Class size averages are 14-16 students in Kindergarten, 18-21 students in grades 1-5, 19 students in middle school and 20 students in high school.

Dual-Credit Program

Students taking Honors Pre-Calculus, Honors and Advanced Placement Calculus at Christian Academy of Louisville may earn college credit through Bellarmine University. Intro to Life Calling is also available for dual-credit enrollment through Indiana Wesleyan University.

High School Program Overview

Graduation Requirements

All students receive an excellent, traditional education in a challenging, academic environment. The **Standard Program** provides a solid foundation which prepares all students for continuing their education beyond high school. The **College Preparatory Program** is much more demanding and includes foreign language coursework required by major colleges and universities. The **Honors Program** offers a rigorous curriculum with the opportunity to earn college credit. Sixty hours of community service must be completed by all students for graduation

22 Credits are required for all three diplomas:

Bible (4 credits)	Fine Arts (1 credit)
English (4 credits)	Computer (1 credit)
Science (4 credits)	Physical Education &
Math (3 credits)	Health (1/2 credit each)
Social Studies (3 credits)	Electives (2 credits)

Additionally, two credits of Foreign Language are required for the Honors and College Preparatory Program diplomas. The Honors Program requires 24 credits and a 3.5 GPA. The College Preparatory Program requires 24 credits and a 3.0 GPA.

Diploma with Fine Arts Designation

Graduates of the School of Fine Arts will also receive a diploma with a Fine Arts Designation reflecting their successful completion of the program requirements. To receive the Fine Arts Designation, students must complete all required coursework and maintain a 3.0 GPA in all classes specific to their fine arts track.
