District Streak Ends, Regional Tournament Begins...

The string of seven consecutive district championships ended when the Lady Centurions fell to tournament host Jeffersonstown by two points. However, there's no time or reason to dwell on the loss when the 7th Region tournament starts on Monday, March 1, and CAL faces a rematch with District 25 champion and #2-ranked Manual. Instead, it's time for the Lady Centurions and their fans to rally and rebound in defense of their regional title.

Jeffersonstown 58 CAL 56 (District 28 Championship)

The warning signs were posted: a district title game hosted by a hungry opponent; a potentially overconfident CAL squad with a convincing win in the previous matchup; early runs in both halves erased by lazy passes and defensive lapses; officiating allowing for physical play by the home team; and a second-half shooting cold snap at the same time the opposing team's offense catches fire. With the alarm sounded, CAL's comeback in the closing minutes bounced off the rim at the buzzer and the District 28 championship belonged to J-town's Lady Chargers.

The Lady Centurions' motion offense claimed an early 8-0 advantage as starters Emily Walden, Allison Karst, China Dow, and Antonita Slaughter scored in a balanced attack. The Lady Chargers' counter-attack was led by Camila Calderon as she drove the lane for lay-ups or to dish the ball to center Lennette Holt. Leading 17-11 after the first quarter, a 9-2 CAL scoring spurt opened up a 13-point lead at 26-13 when Allison Karst made a 3-pointer. However, potential foul trouble for four starters caused them to sit the bench or lessen their defensive intensity, allowing J-town to storm back with a 12-3 run and regain momentum just before halftime.

With rebounds, turnovers, and steals close to a statistical tie in the first half, CAL's four-point edge at 29-25 was largely due to shooting nearly 50% while holding the host team to just under 40%. In the third quarter, the Lady Centurions briefly regain a double-digit lead at 38-28 before the shooting situation reversed and J-town closed the period on a 14-0 run. CAL went cold with point guard Emily Walden's ball handling and court direction out of the game due to foul trouble. By quarter's end, J-town led 42-38 and the mood of the home crowd could sense an upset in the making.

The pattern continued in the fourth period. Although the Lady Centurions continued to battle and rebound, shooting only 25% while the opponent shoots 50% makes it difficult to turn the tide. In the final minutes, the defense caused a few Lady Charger turnovers that created game-tying opportunities, but the lack of a foul call when Walden was injured in the closing seconds turned the ball over to J-town and Slaughter's last-second heave just missed the mark. Sideline notes

--Shooting: When not getting many calls inside and shooting inconsistently from the outside, they need to find the mid-range jumper.
--Defense: The Lady Centurions need to stop the point guard's dribble drive and dish, something sure to show up in regional games.
--Resilience: Even when the shooting was poor in the final quarter, CAL still outscored J-town by an 18-6 margin due to offensive rebounding efforts. Although the game exposed some weaknesses and created more obstacles than usual, this game may serve as a spark to ignite the Lady Centurions as they defend their 7th Region title.
--Injury update: Emily Walden was treated for difficulty breathing after the game, but recovered and should be in good shape for Monday's regional tournament action.

In the District 28 semifinal...

CAL 70 KCD 37

Kentucky Country Day (14-10) had something to prove. With a winning record this season, they knew they could be much more competitive than reflected by their early-season 68-19 loss to the Lady Centurions. In this district semifinal, the Lady Bearcats made their mark in the first quarter. Led by sophomore Shelby Hendricks' ability to post up, drive, or find the open shooter, KCD didn't falter when CAL jumped out 5-0. Instead, they patiently worked the ball well for close-range shots and came back to forge a 13-11 led at the end of the 1st quarter in spite of Antonita Slaughter's 10 points.

In the 2nd quarter, CAL' defensive intensity and rebounding rose to the next level, creating easy baskets off turnovers and putbacks. Outscoring KCD 20-5, the lead was 31-18 at halftime and continued to grow in the 2nd half. Hendricks continued to produce, but her teammates didn't provide enough scoring support. Leading 57-22 after the 3rd quarter, Coach Rice continued his substitution pattern and by game's end twelve CAL players were in the scoring column, including three-pointers off the bench by Makenzie Dale and Paige Gardner, a fast-break putback by Molly Wilder, and two rebounds and two assists by Chalisa Helm. Both teams had cause to celebrate as CAL advanced to the district championship game while KCD proved their hope for the future is real.
